Brad Houghton is the Site Compliance and Ethics Officer (SCEO) at Insitu. In this position, Brad is responsible for working within the Insitu Executive Leadership Team to identify and implement strategies to ensure compliance and ethical behavior. In addition to his duties as SCEO, he also has divisions Argon ST, Boeing Intelligence and Analytics, Digital Receiver Technology Inc, and Liquid Robotics in his portfolio.

Prior to joining Boeing, Brad spent 10 years with the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) as a Joint Target Intelligence Officer at U.S. Central Command, Tampa, Florida and U.S. Strategic Command, Omaha, Nebraska. In this capacity, Brad supervised

125-150 government civilians, contractors and military personnel in the execution of operations in high-paced environments. He planned, coordinated and executed operations, policy compliance, training certification, budget development and execution, and safety and risk management.

Brad routinely interacted with the Joint Chiefs of Staff and Interagency partners on national level policy, compartmented programs, and training standards. He also served as a lead for human resource management across government civilian, contract and military personnel, performing functions including hiring, performance management, counseling, conflict resolution and equal employment opportunity (EEO).

Prior to DIA, Brad spent 25 years as a U.S. Army officer in a variety of command and staff positions.

Brad has received numerous awards and decorations over his career. These include, in the civilian realm, the Central Intelligence Agency's (CIA) Director for Science and Technology John A. McCone award, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (CJCS) Joint Meritorious Service Award, and DIA Special Acts Awards. In the military realm, Brad has received the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, and Defense Meritorious Service Medal.

Brad earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska at Kearney where he

was also a Distinguished Military Graduate. Brad is also a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College and Harvard Kennedy School of Government, Senior Executive Fellows Program.
